

David R. Shlim, M.D. was born in Portland, Oregon, and was educated at Pomona College and Rush Medical College. He worked in family practice and emergency medicine for six years before moving to Nepal to become the Medical Director of the CIWEC Clinic Travel Medicine Center in Kathmandu from 1983 to 1998.

Dr. Shlim has published over 55 peer-reviewed papers on travel-related health risks and is the author of more than two dozen chapters in medical textbooks. He served as an editor of the CDC's *Health Information for International Travel* (The Yellow Book) from 2007 to 2023, and is a past president of the International Society of Travel Medicine. He is co-author of a book on training in compassion called *Medicine and Compassion*, and recently published a prize-winning memoir entitled *A Gentle Rain of Compassion*.

Dr. Shlim has lived in Jackson Hole, Wyoming since 1998, where he practices travel medicine and runs the Medicine and Compassion Project.
